



<b>Weekly focus:</b> What does it mean to 'spread the word' of inclusion? How can we do it? Jump into Spread the Word month by learning the history of the campaign and encouraging students to spread the word all month long!

March 5	Create Spread the Word posters to hang around the school. Check out the <u>Spread the Word logo</u> for inspiration <b>Time:</b> 10-20 minutes	
March 6	Introduce the <u>Spread the Word Bingo Skill Based Exercise</u> . Challenge your students to finish by March 31! <b>Time:</b> 10 minutes	
March 7	Play a game of Inclusion Tiles to see where students are in their inclusion journey. They will play again at the end of the month to see how they've grown.  Time: 10 minutes	
March 8	Assign the End the Word: A Timeline lesson to your middle and high school students.  Time: 25 minutes	





<b>Weekly focus:</b> Inclusion is more than just a thing or an action. It's also a feeling! Have students discover the different emotions they, and others, will feel when they practice inclusion.		
March 11	Have a watch party for <u>Unified Talks: Inclusive Feelings!</u> <b>Time:</b> 5 minutes	
March 12	Pass out the <u>Inclusion Emoji Cards</u> activity. Encourage students to spread inclusion to peers, teachers, and more! <b>Time:</b> 10 minutes	
March 13	Continue to work on the <u>Spread the Word Bingo</u> board. <b>Time:</b> 10 minutes	
March 14	Work on the <u>It's Good to be Different</u> lesson with your elementary students. <b>Time:</b> 25 minutes	
March 15	Take a break and listen to the <u>Spread the Word: Mindfulness Meditation</u> . <b>Time:</b> 5 minutes

March 21	Work with your elementary students on the <u>Inclusion Matters</u> lesson. <b>Time:</b> 25 minutes	
March 22	Sign the virtual <u>Spread the Word pledge</u> . Have more time? Create a class or school wide banner for students to sign! <b>Time:</b> 5 minutes
