THINK FIRST

How can people with intellectual disabilities be included in high schools and in the workplace?

SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS (Or fill out on your own)

After watching Kate give a tour of her bedroom, what similarities do you see between you and Kate?

How would you describe Emily and Kate's friendship? What do Emily and Kate do together?

How does this compare to you and your friends? How is Kate able to share her bracelet-making and baking talents with other students? How do other students respond?

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

What can you learn from Kate's story?

How would Kate want to be included like every other teenager and what steps could you take in your own school and community to do this?
